

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Flooding Incident in Cadiz City, Negros Occidental

as of 04 November 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 23 October 2023 at 4:00 AM, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms caused by localized thunderstorms may have brought possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms to several parts of the country including Western Visayas.

On the same day at around 10:00 AM, several barangays in Cadiz City, Negros Occidental experienced flooding.
