

# DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon in Mindanao

as of 07 July 2025, 6AM

## I. Situation Overview

On 29 June 2025, at around 4:00 PM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms caused by Southwest Monsoon, may have brought flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times, heavy rains in Metro Manila, Ilocos Region, Central Luzon, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Visayas, and Mindanao.

On the same day at around 5:00 PM, several barangays in Maco, Davao de Oro experienced flooding and landslides due to continuous heavy rains brought about by the prevailing Southwest Monsoon.

On 02 July 2025, a landslide was also experienced in Brgy. Tubaon, Tarragona, Davao Oriental due to moderate rainshowers accompanied by lightning and strong wind caused by Southwest Monsoon.

On 05 July 2025, at around 4:00 PM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms caused by Southwest Monsoon, may have brought flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in Metro Manila, Mindanao, Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR), the rest of Cagayan Valley and Central Luzon, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, and Western Visayas.

On the same day, several barangays in Zamboanga City also experienced flooding due to heavy rains brought about by the Southwest Monsoon.


# II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of 1,230 families or 4,121 persons are affected in 10 barangays in Regions IX and XI (see Annex A).

### **Inside Evacuation Center**

There are **640 families** or **1,900 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **seven (7) evacuation centers** in **Region IX** (see Annex B).

## IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **P429,000.00** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families (see Annex C).

## 1. Standby Funds

- ₱93.82 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱6 million available at DSWD FOs IX and XI.
- ₱42 million available in other DSWD FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of Southwest Monsoon in Mindanao through inter-FO augmentation.

## 2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 704,236 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 326,085 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 378,151 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 229,956 FFPs available at DSWD FOs IX and XI.
- 2,100,715 FFPs available in other DSWD FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of Southwest Monsoon in Mindanao through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱846.35 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FOs warehouses.
