

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Flash Flood Incident in Tulumun, North Cotabato

as of 24 October 2025, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 21 October 2025, at approximately 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms caused by Localized Thunderstorms may have brought possible flash floods or thunderstorms during severe thunderstorms in the rest of the country. On the same day, at around 6:00 AM, a flash flood incidents occurred in some barangays in Tulumun, North Cotabato, resulting in the displacement of 150 families or 750 individuals.

In response, the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), through its Field Office-Region XII, is in close coordination with the Local Government Unit of Tulumun, Cotabato for significant updates and any requests of relief augmentation.
