

# DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Low Pressure Area (LPA) 10h and Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ)

as of 29 October 2025, 6AM

## I. Situation Overview

Issued on 26 October 2025 at 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains or thunderstorms due to a Low Pressure Area (LPA) may have caused possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains over Visayas, Mindanao, Bicol Region, and Palawan.

On the same day at around 5:00 PM, several barangays in San Enrique, Iloilo experienced flooding due to continuous heavy rainfall brought by the LPA.

On 27 October 2025 at around 9:00 AM, several municipalities in the Province of Aklan also experienced flooding due to persistent heavy rains associated with the LPA embedded with the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ).

In response, the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), through its Field Office (FO) VI, is closely coordinating with the affected Local Government Units (LGUs) for significant updates and any requests for relief augmentation to address the needs of the affected communities.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **3,336 families** or **11,474 persons** are affected in **41 barangays** in **Region VI** (see Annex A).

# III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of 127 families or 451 persons sought temporary shelter in 13 evacuation centers in Region VI (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **958 families** or **3,625 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

### c. Total Displaced Population

There are 958 families or 3,625 persons still displaced in Region VI (see Annex D).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of three (3) houses were partially damaged in Region VI (see Annex E).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **P182,586.00** worth of assistance was provided by the **LGUs** to the affected families (see Annex F).
