OVERVIEW	<p>On 01 January 2026 at 6:00 AM, DOST-PHIVOLCS released an advisory regarding the rise in the alert level for Mayon Volcano from Alert Level 1 (low-level unrest) to Alert Level 2 (increasing or moderate level unrest), which indicates that there is current unrest driven by shallow magmatic processes that could lead to hazardous magmatic eruption. An increase in rockfall activity from the summit lava dome of Mayon Volcano has been recorded by the visual and seismic monitors of the Mayon Volcano Network.</p> <p>On 6 January 2026 at 1:20 PM, PHIVOLCS-DOST raised the alert status of Mayon Volcano from Alert Level 2 to Alert Level 3 (increased tendency towards a hazardous eruption). This means that Mayon is exhibiting magmatic eruption of a summit lava dome, with increased chances of lava flows and hazardous Pyroclastic Density Currents (PDCs) affecting the upper to middle slopes of the volcano and of potential explosive activity within days or weeks.</p>

A total of 1,143 families or 4,139 persons were affected. Of which, 1,128 families or 4,091 persons were served inside 14 ECs and 15 families or 48 persons were served outside ECs:

# **Progress Report No. 3 for the Mayon Volcano Activity (Region V)**

## **ACTIONS TAKEN**

### **National**

#### **DOST PHIVOLCS**

1. On 06 January 2026, the Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (DOST-PHIVOLCS) raised the Alert Level of Mayon Volcano from Alert Level 2 to Alert Level 3.
2. Deployment of DOST-PHIVOLCS Quick Response Team (QRT)
  - On 08 January 2026, DOST-PHIVOLCS deployed its QRT to Mayon Volcano to conduct the following activities:
    - Field observations and documentation of the timing of events.
    - Deployment of ash collection pans and update of contact information of established ash pan custodians.
    - Conduct remotely-piloted aircraft (RPA) surveys along the flanks of Mayon Volcano
    - Photo-documentation of volcanic activities and impacts
    - Conduct courtesy visits and interviews with DRRM Officers, LGU officials, and local residents.

- Continuous provision of Mayon Volcano Bulletins and other relevant advisories with regard to Mayon activities.
- Continuous coordination with RDRRMC agencies, LGUs affected and other stakeholders to address the response requirements on the ground

8 January 2026

- Continuous provision of Mayon Volcano Bulletins and other relevant advisories with regard to Mayon activities.

- Conducted response cluster meeting for Mayon Alert Level 3

6 January 2026

- Activated RED Alert Status for Mayon (Alert Level 3) operations.
- Activated RDRRMC Response Clusters and RIACC to support operations of LGUs.
- Disseminated advisory to stakeholder to stakeholders and to general public.
- Coordination with LGUs regarding resources and evacuation of population at risk.

5 January 2026

- Attended coordination meeting with PDRRMC Albay, Mayon LGUs and RDRRMC Bicol ICOW Mayon Alert Level 2.

#### **DSWD 5**

07 January 2026

- DSWD FOV, through PSWAD Albay, distributed RTEF packs to displaced families taking temporary shelter

at Mariroc Covered Court, Buang Evacuation Center, and San Jose Elementary School.

- DSWD FOV, with the help of the Philippine Army, delivered 381 Ready-to-Eat Food (RTEF) packs ready for distribution to IDPs in evacuation centers in Malilipot, Albay.
- The Holy Family Parish Church provided family food packs amounting to Php5,880 to 21 displaced families currently seeking temporary shelter at Mariroc Covered Court.

06 January 2026

- DSWD Regional Director Norman S. Laurio, together with Camalig Mayor Hon. Caloy Baldo, distributed 163 Ready-to-Eat Food (RTEF) to IDPs temporarily staying in evacuation centers in Camalig.
- The Philippine Red Cross provided hot meals amounting to Php5,000.00 to displaced families in Camalig, Albay.

05 January 2026

- Prepositioned Family Food Packs (FFPs) across strategic locations and municipalities in Albay for preparedness and quick response.
- 1 mobile kitchen, 1 mobile command center, and 1 mobile water system are on standby and ready for deployment.

## **DILG 5**

06 January 2026

- Issued Provincial Memorandum order “Disaster Preparedness Monitoring relative to the Alert Level 3 of Mt. Mayon Volcano”, to ensure the disaster preparedness protocols especially to those identified LGUs which are classified as high risk, as some of their component barangays are located within the six-kilometer permanent danger zone and are therefore prioritized for evacuation. Particularly Tabaco City, Camalig and Malilipot having the most number population within 6 Km danger zone.
- Activated Provincial EOC at 6PM per Memorandum from the Office of Undersecretary for Local Government; reporting frequency and priority monitoring reports were relayed to all concerned.
- All concerned DILG Field Officers were informed of the activation and advised to establish and oversee the implementation of the critical preparedness actions based on Operation L!sto Protocols for Volcanic Eruptions and respective contingency plans of LGUs.
- Validated the presence of Local Chief Executive of the concerned LGUs (7/7 are present to their respective AOR)
- Continuous Monitoring of DOST-PHIVOLCS Mayon Volcano bulletins and advisories for information and reference
- Close coordination with APSEMO Head on Mayon Operations 2026

05 January 2026

- Attendance to the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (PDRPMC) Meeting at APSEMO Building, Legazpi City.
- Operation L!sto Protocols for Volcanic Eruptions were conveyed during the meeting
- Monitoring of DOST-PHIVOLCS Mayon Volcano bulletins and advisories for information and reference of DILG Officers shared thru DILG-Albay official group chats.

## **PLGU ALBAY**

January 1- 4, 2026

- Issued PDRPMC Advisory No. 1 – implementing no human activity in the 6KM PDZ.

- Released updates and provided media interview for public awareness and information.
