

DSWD DROMIC Report #62 on the Mayon Volcano Seismic Activities as of 03 May 2026, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

As of **02 May 2026**, **Alert Level 3** prevails over Mayon Volcano and entry into the 6-km Permanent Danger Zone remains prohibited. Mayon has been exhibiting an effusive eruption for the 66th consecutive day, generating incandescent lava flows, collapse-fed pyroclastic density currents (PDCs), or “uson,” and rockfalls. Mayon has been demonstrating a brief intensification of unrest, with conditions progressing to a near-steady state since the onset of its eruption. Lava flows have reached radial distances of 1.3 km, 1.6 km, and 3.8 km along the Mi-isi, Bonga, and Basud Gullies, respectively, while rockfall and PDC runouts remained confined within 3 km of the summit crater. Residents within an 8-km radius are advised to prepare for possible evacuation should the alert level be raised to Level 4. The civil aviation authorities advised avoiding flights close to the summit due to ash hazards.

As of 02 May 2026, at approximately 4:28 PM, Mayon Volcano exhibited a lava flow collapse-fed pyroclastic density current (PDC) along Mi-isi Gully on the southwestern slopes. This event also produced rockfalls and ashfall in several municipalities in the west-southwest area of Albay (Camalig, Guinobatan, and Ligao), lasting for about three hours. Mayon has been demonstrating a brief intensification of unrest, with conditions progressing to a near-steady state since the onset of its eruption. Lava flows have reached radial distances of 3.8km, 3.2km, and 1.3 km along the Basud, Bonga, and Mi-isi Gullies, respectively. Residents within an 8-km radius are advised to prepare for possible evacuation should the alert level be raised to Level 4. The civil aviation authorities advised avoiding flights close to the summit due to ash hazards.

On 15 -16 January 2026, a pronounced increase in real-time seismic energy release (RSAM) was recorded by three (3) of 16 stations of the Mayon Volcano Network, despite the absence of volcanic earthquake activity. This increase was induced by an increase in the rate of rockfall and pyroclastic density current or PDC (uson) activity which is an indication of a rise in the rates of lava effusion at the summit crater of Mayon. Strong degassing from the summit was visually observed in the morning with sulfur dioxide or SO₂ flux averaging 4,970 tonnes/day, the highest emission recorded in the last 15 years. To compare, the running average SO₂ flux since 1 January 2026 is 1,205 tonnes/day. As of advisory time, RSAM has begun decreasing, but this episode could forewarn of new intrusions into the Mayon edifice that could lead to further eruptive activity.

On 07 January 2026 between 6:36 PM and 7:00 PM, top crater glow or “banaag” at the summit of Mayon Volcano as superheated volcanic gas from new magma lights up the atmosphere above the crater, and (bottom) incandescent lava dome at the crater with newly-laid incandescent material foam from rockfall and short PDCs or “uson” on the Bonga Gully shed from the dome. Alert level 3 prevails over Mayon and entry into the 6-km PDZ must be prohibited.

On 06 January 2026 at 1:20 PM, the alert status of Mayon Volcano was raised from **Alert Level 2** (increasing unrest) to **Alert Level 3** (increased tendency towards a hazardous eruption), which means that the volcano is exhibiting magmatic eruption of a summit lava dome, with increased chances of lava flows and hazardous PDCs or “uson” affecting the upper to middle slopes of the volcano and of potential explosive activity within days or weeks.

PDCs on the Bonga (southeast) Gully began generating at 12:26 PM today from the collapse of newly extruded lava. The PDCs lasted at least three minutes based on the seismic record and emplaced within two kilometers of the summit crater. In contrast, SO₂ emission remains at baseline or background levels. Short-term ground deformation data from continuous GPS, electronic tilt, and EDM monitoring indicate persistent inflation of the eastern and southeastern slopes since June 2024. The overall monitoring parameters indicate that very slow extrusion of shallow degassed magma is ongoing and is incrementally increasing in rate; i.e., effusive magmatic eruption is taking place.

On 01 January 2026, the Alert Level status was raised from Alert Level 1 to Alert Level 2. The repeated collapse of the unstable summit dome of Mayon Volcano has generated an increasing number and volume of rockfall events. A total of 346 rockfall events and four (4) volcanic earthquakes were recorded since 01 January 2026, compared to 599 rockfall events from November to December 2025. These events had durations of one (1) to five (5) minutes and transported lava debris within a kilometer range of the southern upper slopes. The volume of discrete rockfall, with observed incandescence at nighttime, increased yesterday, signaling an increase in the rate of dome growth and the onset of extrusion of new lava at the crater.

Local Government Units (LGUs) and the public are reminded that entry into the 6-km radius PDZ be evacuated due to the danger of PDCs, lava flows, rockfalls and other volcanic hazards. Increased vigilance against pyroclastic density currents, lahars and sediment-laden streamflows along channels draining the edifice is also advised.

Civil aviation authorities must also advise pilots to avoid flying close to the volcano’s summit as ash from any sudden eruption can be hazardous to aircraft. Based on the current prevailing wind pattern, ash fall events may most likely occur on the south side of the volcano. The Department of Science and Technology – Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (DOST-PHIVOLCS) maintains close monitoring of the Mayon Volcano and any new development will be communicated to all concerned stakeholders.

In response, the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), through Field Office (FO) V, has heightened its alert status, conducting 24/7 monitoring of volcano bulletins, hazard alerts, and field updates. This includes deployments of the Quick Response Teams (QRTs), and specialized vehicles for disaster response, and provision of food and non-food items (FNIs) for the affected population.

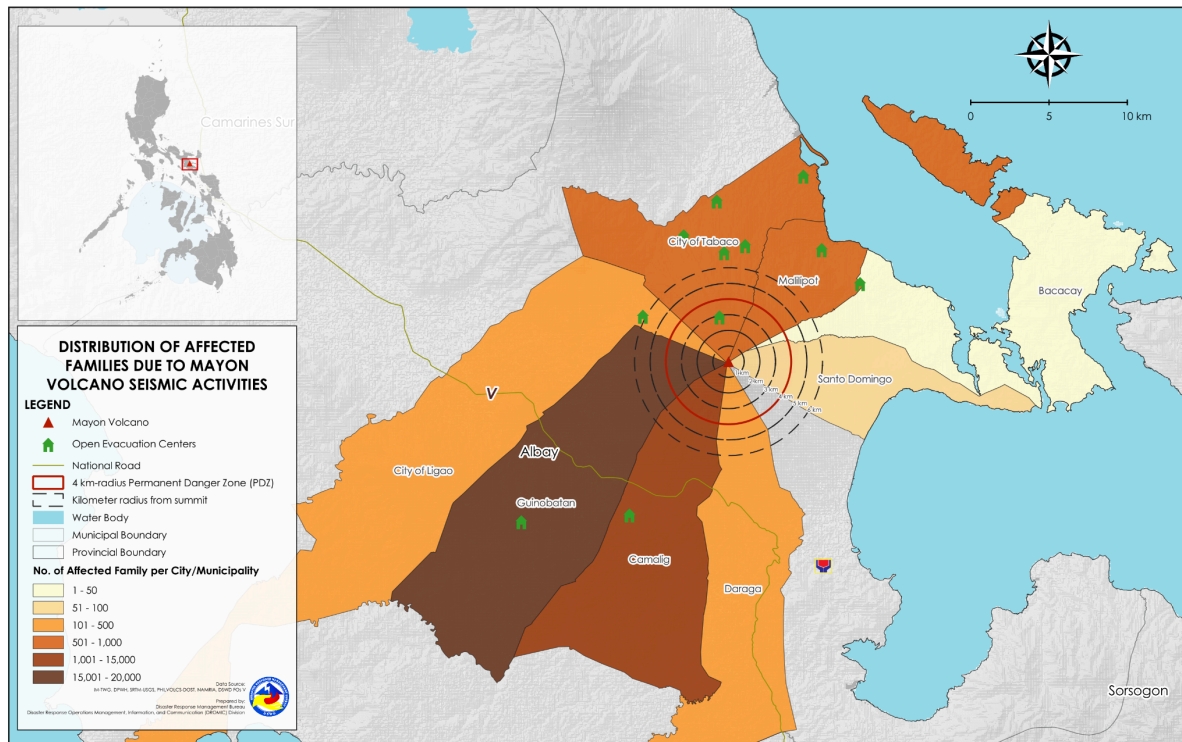
At the same time, DSWD continues to work and coordinate with the affected LGUs on the provision of technical assistance to strengthen their capacity in responding to the needs of displaced communities through the implementation of Camp

Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM), Internally Displaced Persons (IDP) Protection, and the provision of life-saving relief assistance.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **30,522 families** or **102,406 persons** are affected in **87 barangays** in **Region V** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **1,438 families** or **5,440 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **14 evacuation centers** in **Region V** (see Annex B).

There are **26 families** or **85 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex G).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **1,464 families** or **5,525 persons** still displaced in **Region V** (see Annex H).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱82,270,282.07** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱71,608,457.75** from **DSWD**, **₱1,730,877.33** from the **LGUs**, **₱679,904.00** from the **Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs)**, and **₱8,251,042.99** from **other Partners** (see Annex I).
